RESOLUTIONS:

1. SUPPORT OF OUR ARMED FORCES AND FIRST RESPONDERS

Whereas, a strong national defense is essential to the protection of our freedom and the American way of life; and,

Whereas, the members of our armed forces are serving in places of danger to protect our country and to defend and spread freedom throughout the world; and,

Whereas, members of the National Guard and our military have been shamelessly besmirched by the Democrats,

Whereas, members of law enforcement dealt with months of difficult service during the past year, while facing false accusations of racism and hate, having to strike the delicate balance between support of citizen's rights and maintaining community order; and,

Whereas, all our first responders keep us safe from many perils by being always vigilant against threats that are, or may be, upon us here at home;

Therefore, be it resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, extends its heartfelt gratitude and humbly asks God to bless and protect our troops and first responders; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, thanks our U.S. military leaders and personnel for their role in fighting terrorism, and for their continued vigilance throughout the world; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, expects that U.S. military personnel be treated with respect by the leaders of our country, that the military remain always under U.S. command, that our government support our troops with superior equipment and training; that military personnel be put in harm's way only with a clear goal which, when achieved, constitutes victory and an exit strategy; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges our country to support and never forget our veterans who have served in war or in peacetime.

2. SUPPORT OF ELECTION REFORM

Whereas, in the wake of the November 2020 election, many Wisconsin voters are questioning the legitimacy of the results, and continue to be frustrated by inconsistent enforcement of our election laws and voting processes; and,

Whereas, despite reform efforts, the Wisconsin Elections Commission continues to liberally interpret statutes, significantly changing the intent of the Legislature; and,

Whereas, WEC administrators facilitated suspension of certain voting requirements, under the guise of a public
 health emergency, which further eroded controls on voter identification, absentee ballots, and the role of
 special voting deputies; and,

Whereas, some local government officials, following WEC advice, established voting processes and procedures that violated the state's election laws; and,

Whereas, these changes resulted in a substantial increase in unsecured ballots, numerous allegations of
 impropriety, and widespread suspicion of vote fraud; and,

Whereas, appeals to the judiciary branch for resolution of these discrepancies have been largely unsatisfactory; and,

Whereas, the U.S. Constitution allows each State to determine how its electoral votes are awarded, and if awarded by congressional district rather than the statewide popular vote, would provide a more representative voice for people outside of large urban areas, giving them more confidence in the election process;

- 1 Therefore be it resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, demands the
- 2 Legislature thoroughly investigate allegations of fraud in the past election and take action to enforce existing
- 3 law, change laws where warranted, impose stiff fines on government officials or any others that break election
- laws, and require proof of indefinitely confined status that includes medical certification with a 2-year renewal; and,
 - **Be it further resolved,** that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges the Legislature to again reform the Wisconsin Elections Commission, including but not limited to, creating a method to resolve (independent of the court system) issues of statutory interpretation in a timely manner; and,
- Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges the Legislature
 to enforce our existing requirements to properly maintain accurate voter rolls (i.e., cleaning rolls prior to each
 election, removing those fraudulent claiming indefinite confinement), and enacting penalties on clerks or
 administrators for failure to do same; and,
 - **Be it further resolved,** that the Washington County Republican Party, in caucus assembled, strongly urges our Legislature to call for a special session to bring forth a bill that would award one Electoral Vote to the winning party in each of our Congressional Districts, and the remaining two electoral votes be awarded to the political party that wins the majority of Congressional Districts, or split if tied.

3. SUPPORT OF ALL HUMAN LIFE

Whereas, all human beings are created in the image of God, and are thus endowed by their Creator with an unalienable right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness as declared in the Declaration of Independence; and.

Whereas, medical advances continue to scientifically erode previous arguments regarding origin of life, point of fetal viability and usefulness of embryonic stem cells, all of which have been used to affect public opinion; and, *Whereas*, it is the obligation of the United States under the 14th Amendment not to deprive persons of life without due process of law;

Therefore, be it resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, reaffirms its support for the rights the unborn, meaning from the time of conception, as well as its respect for life in all its forms; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, believes that human life should not be treated as a commodity (i.e., human beings which have been aborted, or fetal tissue of any kind, should not be sold), rejects the use of embryonic stem cells for any purpose, rejects the practice of eugenics (e.g. creation of embryos using the DNA from three or more donors), and believes that it is unethical for organizations to monetarily incentivize their patients to have abortions; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, opposes the use of pharmaceutical abortifacients, and supports religious rights objections to government mandates to include within health care plans; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges our state and federal representatives to support legislation that aims to protect the right to life, including but not limited to:

- Requiring parental or legal guardian consent for any minor seeking an abortion;
- Establishing legal protections for the rights of the fathers of unborn children;
- Imposing sanctions on any organization or medical facility that attempts to perform abortions subsequent to the existence of a fetal heartbeat;
- Interposing, on behalf of the unborn, to assert their right to life and stop abortions from being performed;
- Sponsoring and supporting a human life amendment to the U.S. Constitution that would enumerate the right to life of every human being, from conception to natural death.

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges our state and federal legislators to eliminate all public funding for abortion procedures and for any organizations that provide or advocate for ending life in any way, including abortions, assisted suicide or euthanasia; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, supports restrictions on government funding of groups that provide abortion services or counseling outside of the United States.

4. EDUCATION

- **Whereas,** we believe that protecting and promoting a sound education of our children and youth is one of parents' and society's most important responsibilities; and,
- Whereas, parental authority over the educational experiences of their children has been co-opted by teachers
 and administrators who are often not transparent with lessons, assignments and assessments; and,
- 6 Whereas, Wisconsin's school choice and virtual programs empower parents with alternatives to the public
- $7 \qquad \text{schools for the education of their children and lead to greater academic success for many of the 30,000-plus} \\$
- 8 children currently enrolled; and,
- 9 Whereas, government officials, especially at the higher education level, are increasing hostile to the free exchange of ideas, especially those expressing conservative and Christian values; and,
- Whereas, there is increasing interest in adopting learning programs that assess children's social and emotional strengths and seek to engineer social and emotional behavior; and,
- Whereas, the strength and vitality so necessary for our form of government, our welfare as a free people and
- our national identity to be preserved is dependent upon an honest and accurate presentation and
- understanding of our history and founding principles; and,
- 16 Whereas, there have been efforts to rewrite, revise and/or distort our nation's history and founding principles
- 17 to support liberal political and economic ideologies, now termed social justice, rather than presenting our
- history truthfully and in full, inhibiting an informed electorate; and,
- 19 Whereas, the Federal government has mandated that every state collect personal student information, aligned
- 20 with federal Common Education Data Standards, which combined with the use of technology makes this data
- 21 easier to share and utilize, allowing each child to be tracked from birth and/or preschool onward; and,
- 22 Whereas, the U.S. Department of Education amended regulations, under the Family Educational Rights and
- 23 Privacy Act (FERPA), that increase private company and third-party access to student data without parental
- consent, as formerly required; and,
- Whereas, the state of Wisconsin ranks at or near the bottom of assessments for protecting student privacy;

- **Therefore, be it resolved,** that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, supports continued statewide expansion of Wisconsin's school choice program, and the use of vouchers and tax credits, without regard to financial means, for those who select private, virtual or home schooling; and,
- **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, supports local control of schools, urges full transparency as to curriculum content and methods, advocates for parental involvement and empowerment, and opposes all Federal intervention in education; and,
- 33 **Be it further resolved,** that the Washington County Republican Party, in caucus assembled, urges the State
 34 Legislature to incentivize Districts and empower parents who desire to resume in-person learning suspended
 35 by the coronavirus pandemic; and,
- 36 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges our state
- 37 legislators and local school boards to push for curriculum changes that place greater emphasis on the basics
- 38 (including phonics-based early reading instruction, language arts, mathematics, science, history, social studies
- 39 and economics), and eliminate all programs whose objectives are social engineering or advocacy of special
- 40 interests; and,
- 41 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, specifically supports
- 42 academic efforts and curriculum developments (such as those outlined in the Trump Administration's 1776
- 43 Commission Report, issued in January 2021), to restore understanding of the greatness of the American Founding
- 44 and that ensure the presentation of our history and founding principles is objective, truthful and complete, as
- 45 taught in all our educational institutions, including those of higher learning; and,
- 46 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, expresses our deep
- 47 opposition to curriculum and information dissemination that pushes social justice or systemic racism agendas,
- rather than focusing on our common value of equal opportunity and respect for all American citizens; and,
- 49 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges that
- religiously-oriented schools not be discriminated against for exercising their freedom of religion; and demands
- 51 elimination of government funding for any college or university that does not honor free speech for all; and,
- 52 Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges our state
- 53 representatives to adopt measures that counteract the egregious sharing and mining of student data, including
- that resulting from loosened FERPA regulations; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges local school boards and administrators inform parents about the data collection and subsequent sharing that is enabled by increased technology use in classrooms and at home.

5. PROTECTING 2nd AMENDMENT RIGHTS

Whereas, the United States Constitution and the Wisconsin Constitution both affirm the basic human right to keep and bear arms; and,

Whereas, although requiring citizens to request permission from government is an unmistakable violation of that right, since Wisconsin recognized the right to conceal and carry in 2011, over 325,000 residents have received their Concealed Carry License; and,

Whereas, Wisconsin CCL holders, like those across the United States, have proven that responsible gun owners are a benefit to society by promoting freedom and the basic human right of self-defense, while protecting themselves and others from crime; and,

Whereas, allowing law-abiding citizens to carry their weapons in schools and on college campuses would be an effective deterrent against school shootings, and would give these citizens an opportunity to stop active shooters before being victimized.

Therefore, be it resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, demands that our government leaders protect our 2nd Amendment rights by opposing any legislation that would restrict the sale or ownership of lawfully-produced guns, clips/magazines and ammunition, or which would impose extraordinary taxes or fees on same; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, opposes the creation of any form of registry for firearms, accessories or ammunition; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, supports the transition of state law regarding the carry of weapons from "Shall Issue" to "Constitutional Carry", which is enjoyed by residents of the states of Vermont (1791), Montana (1991), Alaska (2003), Arizona (2010), Wyoming (2011), Kansas (2015), Maine (2015), Idaho (2016), Mississippi (2016), West Virginia (2016), Missouri (2017), New Hampshire (2017), North Dakota (2017), South Dakota (2019), Oklahoma (2019), Kentucky (2019) and

28 Arkansas (2020); and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges our Legislature to protect law-abiding citizens from civil litigation in the event they defend themselves or others against imminent death or great bodily harm with a legally-permissible firearm; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges our Legislature to adopt legislation allowing legally-permissible firearms to be carried on school grounds and college campuses.

6. NATIONAL SECURITY

Whereas, the United States exists in a competitive international environment but, as a nation, retains its right to pursue its own interests; and

Whereas, our economic competitiveness and energy resources are a basis for our international power; and **Whereas,** past alliances and relationships with other nations have been unfairly exploited and need to be reexamined, revised and better enforced from time to time;

Therefore, be it resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, supports a strategy of vigorously protecting the homeland and the American people, promoting American prosperity, preserving peace through strength and advancing American influence abroad, where it serves our interests; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, supports efforts to mitigate aggressive intentions of nations who threaten the peace, and to limit development of weapons of mass destruction within such countries; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, supports maintaining a strong military, including extending its capabilities in space and cyber, to ensure the safety of the American people and set conditions for freedom, peace and prosperity in the world.

7. IMMIGRATION REFORM

Whereas, the United States of America was founded by immigrants, as a refuge for immigrants, we have a unique status in the world as a melting pot of cultures; and,

Whereas, legal immigration remains beneficial for our country; and,

Whereas, the longstanding political divide on this issue has resulted in unsecure borders, which is an economic

lure for migrants, an opportunity for terrorists to enter, a potential for increased vote fraud, an additional

4 burden on government spending programs, and allows an underground economy reliant on the labor of

5 undocumented workers; and,

> Whereas, enforcement of existing immigration laws, using border patrols, technology, barriers and worker verification, would enhance the security of our citizens, protect our economy and protect our unique culture;

Therefore, be it resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges our

Congressional representatives to support reforms allowing fair-but-limited legal immigration and to oppose any

11 immigration plan that grants unconditional amnesty to illegal immigrants already in the United States; and,

12 Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, supports the

13 completion of recommended physical barriers along our borders, in whatever manner is most efficient, and to

14 deploy technology or personnel as required to prevent entry by unauthorized migrants; and,

15 Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, recommends that

16 the State of Wisconsin and the Federal Government require that all employers use the E-verify system to check

the citizenship status of all persons who apply to work; and,

18 Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges the State Legislature to 19

pass legislation prohibiting local governments from enacting "local ordinances, resolutions and policies that prohibit

20 enforcement of federal or state laws relating to illegal aliens or immigration status"; and,

21 Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges Congress to rescind

Federal money from established Sanctuary Cities until they comply with State and Federal Laws regarding illegal

23 immigrants, and to prohibit benefits including driver's licenses, subsidized medical services, tuition and mortgages to

> Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, appreciates the Department of Homeland Security leadership, ICE agents and Border Patrol agents and thanks them for their diligence in enforcing U.S. laws to control our borders and detain and deport illegal immigrant criminals.

8. FOUNDATIONS OF THE GOP

Whereas, the Washington County Republican Party honors the long history and involvement of Republicans in creating a nation that is based on equal rights, equal justice and equal opportunity for all, regardless of race, creed, gender, religion, economic status, age or ability and that each person's dignity, liberty and integrity must be protected and respected; and,

Whereas, the fundamental principles of the Republican Party are rooted in the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States of America; and,

Whereas, the Republican Party was founded as an anti-slavery coalition, believing that people had no right to oppress their fellow humans, and thus proclaimed joint opposition of human enslavement and government tyranny; and,

Whereas, the Emancipation Proclamation was issued by President Lincoln, a Republican, which ultimately led to the passage of the 13th and 14th Amendments, by Republicans, and later passage of the 1964 Civil Rights Act, supported largely by Republicans in Congress; and,

Whereas, the Republican Party also drove passage of the 19th Amendment, giving women the right to vote and recognize that women are instrumental to the success of our party, of America and of the world;

Therefore be it resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, affirms its opposition to all discriminatory policies, including those promulgated by federal, state or local governments and to legislation and government initiatives that treat any citizens unequally or prevent citizens from pursuing their individual rights; and,

49 Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, reclaim its

emancipatory character and its civil rights advocacy history, and again become an advocate for the "little guy",

the "forgotten" and the "invisible", including minority and sovereign First Nations within the United States and

52 any others who have faced denials of their liberties or burdensome constraints; and,

53 Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, steadfastly adheres

54 to the following principles that are the core values of our party – individual rights, equal opportunity for all

55 citizens, a government that enables individual talents and does not put obstacles in the way, a military and first responders that defend and protect law-abiding citizens and a judiciary and government officials that do not overstep their authority; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, supports a campaign in concert with the Republican Party of Wisconsin to promote knowledge of the basic foundation of freedom, liberty, and justice for all citizens, and that highlights the history of the Republican Party and Republican principles and emphasizes the importance of citizen involvement to maintain these values.

9. TAXATION AND SPENDING

Whereas, the United States was founded in part due to anger over an environment of excessive taxation and taxation without representation; and,

Whereas, the United States Constitution does allow for taxation for specific reasons to support the general welfare, to be used for the specific purpose appropriated, but Congress continues to abrogate its responsibility to properly budget and appropriate by voting for continuing resolutions and omnibus bills; and, Whereas, our State government was placed on a firm and frugal fiscal path over the past decade under

Whereas, our State government was placed on a firm and frugal fiscal path over the past decade under Republican control;

Therefore, be it resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges our Congressional representatives to oppose continuing resolutions and to return to regular order in both Houses of Congress, including the process of separate budgeting and funding bills for each Department; and, Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, supports alternative ideas to stretch our transportation funding, including reduction in department overhead and waste, prioritization of (and proof of necessity for) proposed projects, segregation of funding to avoid federal wage requirements, and downsizing of contracts to encourage competition; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges passage of legislation that protects homeowners from property tax increases, shifted from commercial property owners, by clarifying that leases and comparisons to "highest and best use" are factored into property assessments.

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, urges our state legislators to develop and pass referendum reforms that will enhance voter awareness and participation, ensure complete transparency in the process, and limit the effect of increased costs to the communities that vote for the taxes; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, demands that all taxing authorities be elected, not appointed, to their positions by the voters in the communities they serve; and,

Be it further resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, calls upon the State Legislature to defend the conservative gains of the past decade and continue to advocate for sound fiscal management, especially avoiding and opposing tax increases.

10. REPEAL OF MINIMUM MARK-UP LAW

Whereas, government, in a free economy, should not be involved in mandating or controlling prices; and, Whereas, Wisconsin retailers remain subject to the Unfair Sales Act, a law passed in the 1930's, which mandates an increased percentage cost be added to the price of consumer goods; and, Whereas, the law, although long outliving its original intended purpose, and vastly different economic times, has been kept alive for the benefit of certain business interests at the expense of others; and, Whereas, the practice of crony capitalism circumvents the free market and is ultimately injurious to

 consumers;

Therefore be it resolved, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, calls upon the State Legislature and Governor to repeal this archaic piece of legislation, the Unfair Sales Act, also known as the minimum mark-up law.
