1 Commendations

2 Commendation Of Congressman Scott Fitzgerald

3 **Whereas**, Congressman Scott Fitzgerald represents the 5th Congressional District in Congress;
4 and,

5 **Whereas**, Congressman Scott Fitzgerald introduced legislation to the 118th Congress to restore
6 education benefits for veterans discharged due to vaccine mandates, to require elementary and
7 secondary school curriculum transparency, and to mitigate abuse of power by unelected
8 bureaucrats; and,

9 **Whereas**, Congressman Scott Fitzgerald voted to defund the additional 87,000 IRS agents
10 approved in the prior Congressional session; and,

11 **Whereas**, Congressman Scott Fitzgerald has voted to establish the Select Committee on
12 Competition with China and the Select Committee on Weaponization of Federal Government;
13 and,

14 **Whereas**, Congressman Scott Fitzgerald has taken positions in favor of domestic energy
15 production, for legislation encouraging manufacturing jobs, for fiscal responsibility as necessary
16 for reducing inflation, for election integrity, for freedom from vaccine mandates, for domestic
17 energy production, for Wisconsin agriculture and small businesses, and other conservative
18 issues;

2 **Whereas**, Senator Johnson shares our conservative principles and is working to protect our
3 interests and the interests of future generations;

4 **Therefore**, the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, thanks Senator Ron
5 Johnson for his commitment to our values and commends him for his determination and service
6 to the people of the state of Wisconsin and the United States of America.

7 **Commendation Of Our State Legislators and Local Office** 8 **Holders**

9 **Whereas**, the Republican state legislators representing Washington County represent us and
10 our **conservative** principles and interests well; and,

11 **Whereas**, these Legislators have worked to constrain the liberal tendencies of our Governor, to
12 protect past conservative legislation, to create a historic budget surplus, and to put our state on
13 a much-improved path for the future; and,

14 **Whereas**, our local, Republican and conservative-minded non-partisan office holders have
15 worked to put these policies into practice;

16 **Therefore**, the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, expresses
17 appreciation to the elected Legislators that represent Washington County and to the local office
18 holders for their commitment to, and practical application of, our conservative principles in state
19 and local government.

1 Resolutions

2 1. Foundations of The Republican Party

3 **Whereas**, the Washington County Republican Party honors the long history and involvement of
4 Republicans in creating a nation that is based on the respect for life, maximum individual rights
5 and freedoms, equal rights, equal justice and equal opportunity for all, regardless of race, creed,
6 gender, religion, economic status, age or ability and that each person's life, dignity, liberty and
7 integrity must be protected and respected; and,

8 **Whereas**, the fundamental principles of the Republican Party are rooted in the Declaration of
9 Independence and the Constitution of the United States of America; and,

10 **Whereas**, the Republican Party was founded as an anti-slavery coalition, believing that people
11 had no right to oppress their fellow humans, and thus proclaimed joint opposition of human
12 enslavement and government tyranny; and,

13 **Whereas**, the Emancipation Proclamation was issued by President Lincoln, a Republican,
14 which ultimately led to the passage of the 13th and 14th Amendments, by Republicans, and later
15 passage of the 1964 Civil Rights Act, supported largely by Republicans in Congress; and,

16 **Whereas**, the Republican Party also drove passage of the 19th Amendment, giving women the
17 right to vote and recognize that women are instrumental to the success of our party, of America
18 and of the world;

19 **Therefore be it resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
20 affirms its opposition to all discriminatory policies, including those promulgated by federal, state
21 or local governments and to legislation and government initiatives that treat any citizens
22 unequally or prevent citizens from pursuing their individual rights; and,

23 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
24 reclaim its emancipatory character and its civil rights advocacy history, and again become an
25 advocate for the “little guy”, the “forgotten” and the “invisible”, including minority and sovereign
26 First Nations within the United States and any others who have faced denials of their life,
27 liberties and/or pursuit of happiness, or burdensome constraints; and,

28 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
29 steadfastly adheres to the following principles that are the core values of our party – maximum
30 individual rights (especially including our First, Second, Fourth, Sixth, Ninth and Tenth
31 Amendment rights), equal opportunity for all citizens, a government that enables individual
32 talents and does not put obstacles in the way, free enterprise, a military and first responders

1 that defend and protect law-abiding citizens and a judiciary and government officials that do not
2 overstep their authority; and,

3 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
4 supports a campaign in concert with the Republican Party of Wisconsin to promote knowledge
5 of the basic foundation of life, freedom, liberty, and justice for all citizens, and that highlights the
6 history of the Republican Party and Republican principles and emphasizes the importance of
7 citizen involvement to maintain these values.

8 **2. Support for Our Armed Forces and First Responders**

9 **Whereas**, a strong national defense is essential to the protection of our freedom and the
10 American way of life; and,

11 **Whereas**, the members of our armed forces are serving in places of danger to protect our
12 country and to defend and spread freedom throughout the world; and,

13 **Whereas**, the members of our armed forces have been subjected to forced medical
14 experimentation through the requirement to accept mRNA injections (“vaccines”); and,

15 **Whereas**, members of law enforcement have to face false accusations of racism and hate,
16 striking a delicate balance between support of citizen’s rights and maintaining community order;
17 and,

18 **Whereas**, all our first responders keep us safe from many perils by being always vigilant against
19 threats that are, or may be, upon us here at home; and,

20 **Whereas**, all U.S. military personnel, law enforcement officials, and first responders are entitled
21 to every opportunity to increase their technical skills free from divisive political or social
22 agendas;

23 **Therefore, be it resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
24 extends its heartfelt gratitude and thanks to its troops and first responders and to the families of
25 all who have been injured and killed in the line of duty; and,

26 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled
27 urges our President and U.S. military leaders to uphold the U.S. Constitution and refrain from
28 divisive politics for the safety and honor of our military and United States of America; and,

29 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
30 expects that U.S. military personnel be treated with respect by the leaders of our country, that
31 the military remain always under U.S. command, that our government support our troops with

1 superior equipment and training, that military personnel be put in harm's way only with a clear
2 goal which, when achieved, constitutes victory, and an exit strategy; and,

3 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
4 urges our President and U.S. military leaders to restore to good standing all U.S. service
5 members dismissed for declining the mRNA injections (“vaccines”), with full benefits and
6 restorative compensation, and with a full and public apology from the President; and,

7 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
8 urges our country to support and never forget our veterans who have served in war or in
9 peacetime, including those who served, were injured, or killed in Afghanistan and related lands;
10 and,

11 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
12 expects that all U.S. military personnel, law enforcement officials, and first responders receive
13 technically effective training free from indoctrination into divisive political or social agendas; and,

14 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party humbly asks God to
15 bless and protect our troops, first responders, and, through them and our own resolve, our state
16 of Wisconsin and the United States of America.

17 **3. Support for Election Integrity**

18 **Whereas**, in the wake of recent elections, many Wisconsin voters are questioning the legitimacy
19 of the results, and continue to be frustrated by inconsistent enforcement of our election laws and
20 voting processes; and,

21 **Whereas**, during the 2020 November election, 200+ local Wisconsin election offices in
22 Wisconsin were influenced by more than \$10 million received through a “COVID 19 Response
23 Grant Program” distributed by special interest group Center for Tech and Civic Life that was
24 bankrolled by Mark Zuckerberg; and,

25 **Whereas**, WEC administrators facilitated suspension of certain voting requirements, under the
26 guise of a public health emergency, which further eroded controls on voter identification,
27 absentee ballots, and the role of special voting deputies; and,

28 **Whereas**, some local government officials, following faulty WEC advice, established voting
29 processes and procedures that violated the state’s election laws; and,

30 **Whereas**, these changes resulted in a substantial increase in unsecured ballots, numerous
31 allegations of impropriety, and widespread suspicion of voter fraud; and,

1 **Whereas**, appeals to the judiciary branch for resolution of these discrepancies have been
2 largely unsatisfactory; and,

3 **Whereas**, recent congressional attempts to federalize state elections, and presidential
4 executive orders directing federal agencies to develop strategic plans to leverage taxpayer
5 resources to expand voter registration and voter participation, are in direct conflict with the
6 constitutional authority granted to each state to administer elections; and,

7 **Whereas**, some states and electoral districts have adopted ranked choice voting, which, on its
8 face, seems simple and fair, but is confusing for the voter who wants to make intelligent
9 choices, requires more time to count the ballots and determine a winner, is subject to having
10 votes miscounted or difficult to audit, can cause some votes to be exhausted or set aside in the
11 counting process, and may lead to a candidate not truly supported by the collective will of the
12 electorate being elected even without a majority of all votes, as is claimed to be its strength;

13 **Therefore be it resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
14 strongly urges the Legislature to enforce our existing election laws and enact laws that support
15 secure voter registration, secure voting by mail, promote accurate and fast ballot counting,
16 promote transparency in elections, and create accountability for election officials; and,

17 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
18 urges the Legislature to enact legislation that prohibits local governments from accepting private
19 funding from individuals and third parties; and,

20 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
21 urges the Legislature to again reform the Wisconsin Elections Commission, including but not
22 limited to, creating a method to resolve (independent of the court system) issues of statutory
23 interpretation in a timely manner; and,

24 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
25 urges our elected officials to defend Wisconsin's constitutional authority to administer free and
26 fair elections that are not influenced by unconstitutional federal overreach; and,

27 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
28 urges our elected officials to prohibit ranked choice voting in state and local elections, as
29 multiple states have done already, to retain accuracy, integrity, legality and timeliness in
30 determining election results and count every vote toward the final outcome.

31 **4. Support for All Human Life**

32 **Whereas**, all human beings are created in the image of God, and are thus endowed by their
33 Creator with an unalienable right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness as declared in the
34 Declaration of Independence; and,

1 **Whereas**, medical advances continue to scientifically erode previous arguments regarding
2 origin of life, point of fetal viability, and usefulness of embryonic stem cells, all of which have
3 been used to affect public opinion; and,

4 **Whereas**, it is the obligation of the United States under the Fourteenth Amendment not to
5 deprive persons of life without due process of law; and,

6 **Whereas**, the Supreme Court of the United States overturned Roe v. Wade, leaving the matter
7 of abortion to the states, though disregarding protections of human life that may be found in the
8 Fourteenth Amendment; and,

9 **Whereas**, Wisconsin's anti-abortion statute 940.04 is in effect, which states that an unborn child
10 is a human being from the time of conception; and,

11 **Whereas**, abortions can be induced by the use of abortion pills and certain birth control
12 methods that prevent implantation of a fertilized egg; and,

13 **Whereas**, Governor Evers and Attorney General Kaul are attempting to revise, remove, or
14 circumvent statute 940.04, which makes the non-maternal act of performing an abortion a
15 felony; and,

16 **Whereas**, the FDA finalized a Biden rule change to make dangerous abortion-inducing pills
17 more widely available as permitted by law, but including through the mail; and,

18 **Whereas**, widespread availability of abortion-inducing pills may spawn a black market for them
19 with resulting injury and death to pregnant women and girls; and,

20 **Whereas**, there exist resource centers dedicated to helping pregnant women and their children;

21 **Therefore, be it resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
22 reaffirms its support for the rights of the unborn, meaning from the time of conception, as well as
23 its respect for life in all its forms; and,

24 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
25 believes that human life should not be treated as a commodity (i.e., human beings which have
26 been aborted, or fetal tissue of any kind, should not be sold), rejects the use of embryonic stem
27 cells for any purpose, rejects the practice of eugenics (e.g. creation of embryos using the DNA
28 from three or more donors), and believes that it is unethical for organizations to monetarily
29 incentivize their patients to have abortions; and,

30 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
31 opposes the use of pharmaceutical abortifacients, and supports religious rights objections to
32 government mandates to include abortion within health care plans; and,

1 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
2 urges our federal representatives to support legislation that aims to protect the right to life,
3 including but not limited to:

4 Opposing federal attempts to circumvent Wisconsin statutes protecting the lives of the
5 unborn;

6 Reversing action of the FDA to make abortion-inducing pills available across state lines
7 and without an in-person doctor/patient relationship;

8 Working to eliminate all public funding for abortion procedures and for any businesses,
9 organizations, or governments in or outside of the United States that provide or advocate
10 for ending life in any way, including abortions, assisted suicide or euthanasia;

11 Sponsoring and supporting a human life amendment to the U.S. Constitution that would
12 enumerate the right to life of every human being, from conception to natural death; and,

13 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
14 urges respect and support for those agencies that assist women experiencing hardship due to
15 pregnancy.

16 **5. Support for Education**

17 **Whereas**, we believe that protecting and promoting a sound education of our children and youth
18 is one of parents' and society's most important responsibilities; and,

19 **Whereas**, parental authority over the educational experiences of their children has often been
20 co-opted by teachers and administrators who are not transparent with lessons, assignments,
21 and assessments; and,

22 **Whereas**, parents have a fundamental right to be included in decisions surrounding the names
23 and pronouns that staff use to refer to their children while at school; and,

24 **Whereas**, Wisconsin's school choice and virtual programs empower parents with alternatives to
25 the public schools for the education of their children and lead to greater academic success for
26 many children currently enrolled; and,

27 **Whereas**, government officials, especially at the higher education level, are increasingly hostile
28 to the free exchange of ideas, especially those expressing conservative and Christian values;
29 and,

1 **Whereas**, there is increasing interest in adopting learning programs that assess children’s
2 social and emotional health and seek to engineer social and emotional behavior, co-opting
3 parental responsibility and authority; and,

4 **Whereas**, the strength and vitality so necessary for our form of government, our welfare as a
5 free people, and our national identity to be preserved is dependent upon an honest and
6 accurate presentation and understanding the history of the United States, its founding principles
7 of freedom, limited government, individual responsibility, and the rule of law; and,

8 **Whereas**, there have been efforts to rewrite, revise and/or distort our nation’s history and
9 founding principles to support and promote liberal political and economic ideologies, now
10 termed “justice” (social, racial, environmental, climate, etc.), rather than presenting our history
11 truthfully and in full, inhibiting an informed electorate; and,

12 **Therefore, be it resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
13 supports local control of schools, urges full transparency as to curriculum content and methods,
14 advocates for parental involvement and empowerment, and opposes all state and federal
15 intervention in education, as well as unquestioned obeisance to non-governmental
16 organizations that establish de facto standards; and,

17 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
18 encourages local school boards to adopt policies stating the district and its employees shall
19 address all students by their legal name or commonly associated nickname and pronouns
20 associated with the student’s biological sex unless otherwise authorized in writing by the
21 student’s parent/guardian; and,

22 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
23 supports continued statewide expansion of Wisconsin’s school choice program, and the use of
24 vouchers and tax credits, without regard to financial means, for those who select private, virtual
25 or home schooling; and,

26 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party, in caucus assembled,
27 urges that the state legislature not use funding to incentivize local school boards against the will
28 of their constituents; and,

29 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
30 urges our state legislators and local school boards to push for curriculum changes that place
31 greater emphasis on the basics (including phonics-based early reading instruction, language
32 arts, mathematics, science, history, social studies and economics), and eliminate all programs
33 and coursework whose objectives are social engineering or advocacy of liberal political and
34 economic ideologies; and,

35 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
36 specifically supports academic efforts and curriculum developments to restore understanding of

1 the greatness of the American founding, free markets and capitalism in contrast to socialism
2 and other non-free systems, and to ensure that the presentation of our history and founding
3 principles is objective, truthful and complete, and taught in all our educational institutions,
4 including those of higher learning; and,

5 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
6 expresses our deep opposition to curriculum and information dissemination that pushes social
7 justice or systemic racism agendas, rather than focusing on our common values of equal
8 opportunity and respect for all American citizens; and,

9 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
10 urges that religiously-oriented schools not be discriminated against for exercising their freedom
11 of religion; and demands elimination of government funding for any college or university that
12 does not honor free speech for all.

13 **6. Support for Gender Health in Minors**

14 **Whereas**, vulnerable minors do not have the maturity to give informed consent for physical
15 treatments of gender dysphoria, including medications to delay puberty, cross-sex hormones or
16 surgery to feminize or masculinize the body; and,

17 **Whereas**, education practices increasingly discuss, encourage, and even promote gender
18 dysphoria and gender transition, sometimes without the knowledge or consent of parents; and,

19 **Whereas**, legislation is needed to preserve women's sports and protect girls and women from
20 competing against transgender athletes, since hormone treatments cannot undo the effect of
21 male chromosomes on the performance of competitive athletes, and athletic opportunities for
22 transgender students can be provided by coed leagues; and,

23 **Whereas**, treatments for gender dysphoria, which encourage acceptance of one's biological
24 gender, are often successful, notwithstanding efforts to outlaw such treatments;

25 **Therefore be it resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
26 strongly encourages legislation banning physical treatments of gender dysphoria in minors and
27 allowing a person so treated the right to recover damages against parents, medical staff, or
28 other third parties at any future date; and

29 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
30 urges local school boards to adopt policies that prohibit school personnel from encouraging
31 minor children to desire or seek physical treatments or gender transitioning for gender
32 dysphoria; and,

1 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
2 urges that legislation to preserve women’s and girls’ sports for biological females be enacted;
3 and

4 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
5 endorses legislation that permits psychological treatment of gender dysphoria.

6 **7. Protecting Second Amendment Rights**

7 **Whereas**, the United States Constitution and the Wisconsin Constitution both affirm the basic
8 human right to keep and bear arms; and,

9 **Whereas**, Wisconsin recognized the right to conceal and carry in 2011, and many residents
10 have received their Concealed Carry License (CCL); and,

11 **Whereas**, Wisconsin CCL holders, like those across the United States, have proven that
12 responsible gun owners are a benefit to society by promoting freedom and the basic human
13 right of self-defense, while protecting themselves and others from crime; and,

14 **Whereas**, requiring citizens to request permission from government to utilize their 2nd
15 Amendment rights is an unmistakable violation of that right; and,

16 **Whereas**, allowing law-abiding citizens to carry their weapons in schools and on college
17 campuses is allowed under Federal Statute 18 USC 922(q)(2)(B) under certain circumstances
18 and that allowance would be an effective deterrent against school shootings, and would give
19 these citizens an opportunity to stop active shooters before being victimized;

20 **Therefore, be it resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
21 demands that our government leaders protect our 2nd Amendment rights by opposing any
22 legislation that would restrict the sale or ownership of lawfully produced guns, clips/magazines
23 and ammunition, or which would impose additional taxes or fees on same; and,

24 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
25 opposes the creation of any form of registry for firearms, accessories or ammunition; and,

26 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
27 supports the transition of state law regarding the carry of weapons from “Shall Issue” to
28 “Constitutional Carry,” which is enjoyed by residents of many states; and,

29 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
30 urges our Legislature to protect law-abiding citizens from civil litigation in the event they defend
31 themselves or others against imminent death or great bodily harm with a legally-permissible
32 firearm; and,

1 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
2 urges our Legislature to adopt legislation allowing firearms to be carried on school grounds and
3 college campuses by Wisconsin CCL holders meeting the requirements of Federal law.

4 **8. Protecting National Security**

5 **Whereas**, the United States exists in a competitive international environment but, as a nation,
6 retains its right to pursue its own interests; and

7 **Whereas**, our economic competitiveness and energy resources are a basis for our international
8 power, and increasing national debt, climate change hysteria, and threats to national
9 sovereignty jeopardize these advantages; and

10 **Whereas**, past alliances and relationships with other nations have been unfairly exploited and
11 need to be reexamined, revised and better enforced from time to time; and,

12 **Whereas**, porous and open borders with hasty release of illegal immigrants, and acceptance of
13 unvetted refugees permits stealth entry of criminals and dangerous individuals;

14 **Therefore, be it resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
15 supports a strategy of vigorously protecting the homeland and the American people, promoting
16 American prosperity, preserving peace through strength, and advancing American influence
17 abroad, where it serves our interests; and,

18 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled, call
19 upon our federal representatives and citizens to recognize the critical nature of fiscal and
20 economic solvency for the continuation of our freedoms as a nation; and,

21 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
22 calls upon our federal representatives to exhaustively champion and pass legislation and
23 policies promoting the economic independence of the United States; and,

24 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
25 supports maintaining a strong military, including extending its capabilities in space and cyber, to
26 ensure the safety of the American people and set conditions for freedom, peace and prosperity
27 in the world; and,

28 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party encourage our U.S.
29 Congress and U.S. President to insure that the United States of America is not dependent on
30 any foreign power for the resources, technologies, and know-how for the country to defend itself
31 against subtle and open aggression; and,

1 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party encourage our U.S.
2 Congress and U.S. President to finally secure our borders, and insure that the United States of
3 America is not infiltrated by dangerous individuals intent on doing us harm.

4 **9. Support for Immigration Action**

5 **Whereas**, the United States of America was founded by immigrants, as a refuge for immigrants,
6 we have a unique status in the world as a melting pot of cultures; and,

7 **Whereas**, legal immigration remains beneficial for our country and is encouraged; and,

8 **Whereas**, illegal immigration, embraced and enabled by the administration of President Joe
9 Biden fosters human trafficking, drug trafficking, an underground labor economy, increased
10 crime, fraudulent identities, and voting violations, and imposes a heavy burden on the legal
11 citizens and taxpayers of this nation; and,

12 **Whereas**, consistent enforcement of existing immigration laws, using border patrols, border
13 walls, technology, and worker verification, would enhance the physical and economic security of
14 our citizens; and,

15 **Whereas**, the Biden administration is disregarding our immigration laws and encouraging mass
16 illegal immigration without limits;

17 **Therefore, be it resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
18 urges our Congressional representatives to support fair and legal immigration and oppose any
19 immigration plan that grants unconditional amnesty to illegal immigrants already in the United
20 States; and,

21 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
22 seeks the completion of physical barriers along our borders in whatever manner is most
23 efficient, and to deploy technology or personnel, as required, to prevent entry by unauthorized
24 immigrants; and,

25 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
26 recommends that the state of Wisconsin and the federal government require that all employers
27 use the E-verify system to check the citizenship status of all persons who apply to work; and,

28 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
29 urges the state legislature to pass legislation prohibiting local governments from enacting local
30 ordinances, resolutions, and policies that prohibit enforcement of federal or state laws relating to
31 illegal aliens or immigration status; and,

1 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
2 urges Congress to rescind federal money from established sanctuary cities until they comply
3 with state and federal laws regarding illegal immigrants, and to prohibit benefits including

5 citizens; and,

6 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
7 urges our Congressional representatives to work toward a merit-based immigration system, end
8 chain migration, and end universal birthright citizenship; and,

9 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
10 appreciates the Department of Homeland Security leadership, Immigration and Customs
11 Enforcement (ICE) agents, and Border Patrol agents and thanks them for their diligence in
12 enforcing U.S. laws to control our borders and detain and deport illegal immigrant criminals.

13 **10. Taxation and Spending**

14 **Whereas**, the United States was founded in part due to anger over an environment of excessive
15 taxation and taxation without representation; and,

16 **Whereas**, the United States Constitution gives Congress the power to “lay and collect taxes,
17 duties, imposts and excises, to pay the debts and provide for the common defense and general
18 welfare of the United States, and Congress continues to ignore its responsibility to properly
19 budget and appropriate by voting for continuing resolutions and omnibus bills; and,

20 **Whereas**, the federal government works against the average citizen in the long run with deficit
21 spending that necessitates higher taxes and imposes hidden taxes in the form of inflation, lower
22 real wages, lower actual savings, and higher daily costs; and,

23 **Whereas**, the United States national debt has risen to over \$246,000 per taxpayer; and

24 **Whereas**, our Wisconsin state government was placed on a firm and frugal fiscal path over the
25 past decade under Republican control;

26 **Therefore, be it resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
27 urges our Congressional representatives to oppose continuing resolutions and to return to
28 regular order in both Houses of Congress, including the process of separate budgeting and
29 funding bills for each Department; and,

30 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
31 urges our Congressional representatives to pass budgets that begin to and continuously reduce
32 the national debt and put us on a sustainable path of economic wellbeing; and,.

1 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
2 demands that all taxing authorities be elected, not appointed, to their positions by the voters in
3 the communities they serve; and,

5 supports alternative ideas to stretch our state transportation funding, including reduction in
6 department overhead and waste, prioritization of (and proof of necessity for) proposed projects,
7 segregation of funding to avoid federal wage requirements, and downsizing of contracts to
8 encourage competition; and,

9 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
10 calls upon the state legislature to defend the conservative gains of the past decade when under
11 Republican control, and continue to advocate for sound fiscal management, especially avoiding
12 and opposing tax increases.

13 **11. Pandemic Responsibility and Response**

14 **Whereas**, documentary evidence shows that the Covid-19 pandemic somehow evolved from
15 experiments intended to find ways to avoid and treat such illnesses as a matter of national
16 defense; and,

17 **Whereas**, readily available medications for the prevention and treatment of Covid-19 became
18 known, but were suppressed in favor of far more expensive, experimental treatments, some of
19 which were classified as “vaccines,” though requiring a redefinition of the word; and,

20 **Whereas**, the media and corporate interests have gladly and foolishly adopted the pandemic
21 narrative, manufacturing a public health emergency that continues to threaten the very
22 freedoms citizens of the United States of America have known and loved; and,

23 **Whereas**, the pandemic and response has cast serious doubt about the integrity of government
24 health agencies and revealed the extent to which major medical and business operations will
25 influence or submit themselves to government agencies in spite of the true science of the
26 situation; and,

27 **Whereas**, major media entities have proven themselves to be self-serving with respect to their
28 advertisers and public service announcements, ignoring the true interests of the people; and,

29 **Whereas**, Senator Ron Johnson has held public sessions wherein qualified medical
30 professionals and others have told of their experiences whereby the government agencies and
31 cooperating hospitals have withheld or caused to be withheld preventative and curative
32 treatments for Covid-19, leaving doctors and nurses to stand by and watch their patients die;
33 and that the Covid “vaccines” are causing adverse reactions and death; and,

1 **Whereas**, there is a continued and deliberate lack of focus on injuries and deaths associated
2 with these Covid-19 “vaccines”;

3 **Therefore, be it resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
4 commends Senator Ron Johnson and all doctors, nurses, lawyers, researchers, investigators,
5 and mothers and fathers, who fought and continue to fight for our medical freedom; and,

6 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
7 urges our federal representatives to work together to expose and fully educate the public on the
8 true source of the Covid-19 pandemic and the true nature of the response and bring to justice
9 those involved in negligent, self-serving or criminal behavior; and

10 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
11 urges our federal representatives to require an honest and scientific assessment of the effects
12 of the Covid-19 medications from the CDC and FDA; and,

13 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
14 urges our federal representatives to require of the FDA that any follow-on medications of the
15 mRNA type be thoroughly tested and not merely adopted as if they were already approved for
16 Covid-19 treatment; and,

17 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
18 urges our elected federal and state representatives to block any and all mandates for Covid-19
19 and mRNA “vaccines” and ensure that people can opt-out for medical, religious and patient and
20 parental rights to choose their own treatments and the greater good of individual medical
21 freedom.

22 **Floor Resolution 1: Resolution Demanding the Second** 23 **Passage of a Constitutional Amendment Resolution Banning** 24 **Outside Money in Wisconsin’s Elections**

25 **Whereas**, millions of dollars in private funds have been illegally (since it is bribery) "donated" to
26 Wisconsin municipalities by the Leftist, Mark Zuckerberg-funded group, CTCL, and other private
27 groups since 2020 for the purposes of wrongfully interfering in illegally manipulating, and
28 criminally stealing Wisconsin elections; and,

29 **Whereas**, according to reports issued by the Gableman investigation, the Assembly Elections
30 Committee hearing, the Thomas Moore Society (i.e., its Amistad Project), and other reputable
31 entities, the infusion of private money into Wisconsin elections has illegally changed the
32 outcome of these elections; and,

33 **Whereas**, the City of Madison, Wisconsin, (which accepted these illegal "Zuckerberg bucks" in
34 2020 and committed election fraud in numerous ways, such as its illegal, weeks-too-early (in

1 violation of Wisconsin Statutes section 6.86(1)(b)) in-person voting during its so-called
2 "Democracy [i.e., fraud] in the Park" on Saturdays 9/26/2020 and 10/3/2020) in mid-January
3 2023 accepted an additional \$1.5 million in private funding to administer elections, and the City
4 of Milwaukee, other Wisconsin cities, and the Wisconsin University System have accepted or
5 are currently considering approval of similar illegal donations; and,

6 **Whereas**, the Governor of Wisconsin has refused to sign legislation banning the use of private
7 funds (e.g. "your" 2024 'elections' sponsored by TikTok - a huge, international, Leftist social
8 media company just like Zuckerberg's Facebook) in the administration of Wisconsin's elections;
9 and,

10 **Whereas**, the Wisconsin Constitution can be amended without the Governor's signature by both
11 the Assembly and Senate passing a resolution in two consecutive sessions and then putting the
12 resolution on the ballot for the people of Wisconsin to approve; and,

13 **Whereas**, in the last legislative session, the Wisconsin Assembly and the Wisconsin Senate
14 passed such a resolution to amend the Wisconsin Constitution to ban the use of private funds in
15 Wisconsin's elections; and,

16 **Whereas**, Speaker Robin Vos and Senate leader Devin LeMahieu led the people of Wisconsin
17 to believe that the resolution would be passed a second time in the January 2023 session and
18 put on the ballot in April 2023 so the voters can decide the issue; and,

19 **Whereas**, Speaker Vos now has decided to not bring this resolution to the floor for a second
20 vote in the Assembly and the Wisconsin Senate has not brought the resolution to the floor
21 based on the dubious theory that the resolution would bring out Democrat voters and impact the
22 State Supreme Court race; and,

23 **Whereas**, a recent grass-roots survey taken of Republican voters in Wisconsin and presented
24 to Speaker Vos showed over 85% of them would vote in favor of a constitutional amendment
25 banning the use of private funds by governments in Wisconsin; and,

26 **Whereas**, having the resolution on the April ballot actually would have had the effect of drawing
27 many more conservative and Republican voters to the polls in April 2023, thus assuring a
28 conservative Justice is elected to the Wisconsin Supreme Court;

29 **Therefore be it resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
30 demand that Speaker Robin Vos brings the resolution to the floor of the Assembly for a second
31 vote by no later than March 20, 2023; and,

32 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
33 demands that Senate leader Devin LeMahieu bring the resolution to the floor of the Senate for a
34 second vote by no later than April 3, 2023; and,

1 **Be it further resolved**, that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
2 demands that the passed resolution be included on the very next statewide ballot (which may
3 now have to be April, 2024) for consideration by the voters of Wisconsin; and,

4 **Be it further resolved**, that the Wisconsin Legislature protect our constitutional right to have
5 our individual votes fully and properly counted in every election and not be diluted by illegal
6 (bribery), criminal-election-stealing outside money, influence, and partisan/one-sided get-out-
7 the-vote (GOTV) efforts.

8 **Floor Resolution 2: Resolution for Enhanced Membership** 9 **Criteria for the Republican Party of Washington County**

10 **Whereas**, Article II (Purpose) of the Constitution of the Republican Party of Washington County
11 (WCRP) currently states:

12 "The purpose of this organization shall be to correlate and unify under one central
13 organization the activities of the Republican Party of Washington County, and to
14 advance in every honorable way fundamental Republican principles and policies and as
15 a voluntary organization cooperate and assist in all county, state and national elections,
16 to the end that our republican form of government as created under the Constitution of
17 the United States and the State of Wisconsin be preserved for all of the people.

18 As a constituent part of the Republican State Voluntary Organization this organization
19 shall direct, manage, supervise and control the business property and funds of the
20 Republican Party of Washington County"; and,

21 **Whereas**, Article III (Membership) of the Constitution of the Republican Party of Washington
22 County (WCRP) currently states:

23 "Membership in this organization shall be open to all Washington County citizens of
24 voting age who believe in the above objectives, purposes and principles of the
25 Republican Party.

26 Qualified and voting members of this organization shall be:

- 27 1) Those Republicans in good standing who have been recorded by the Treasurer of
28 this organization for at least thirty (30) days prior to any meeting or caucus.
29 2) 'In good standing' means those members who have registered with the Treasurer
30 of the county party who are current in any dues set by the county party, if any"; and,

31 **Whereas**, by the membership criteria above, notorious Republicans In Name Only (RINOs)
32 such as former (voted out of office) Wyoming Congressperson Liz Cheney (who was booted out
33 of her county GOP organization), and disgraced Wisconsin Elections Commission (WEC)
34 member, former-Republican, Marge Bostelmann (i.e., she was expelled from the Green Lake

1 County Republican Party because "her actions do not reflect the party's values and beliefs of
2 "supporting the proper enforcement of the law and of election integrity") would actually both be
3 eligible for membership in the Washington County Republican Party as long as they lived in
4 Washington County, timely registered with the treasurer and paid their dues; and,

5 **Whereas**, those people who have undermined our U.S. Constitution, Wisconsin Constitution,
6 laws, and/or elections by promoting/supporting deliberate lies (e.g., that the events of 1/6/2021
7 were an "insurrection"), falsely impeaching an innocent President, illegally promoting/supporting
8 illegal ballot drop boxes in Wisconsin in 2020, illegally allowing the Democrats' illegal
9 "Democracy [i.e., election fraud] in the Park" by weeks-too-early (in violation of Wisconsin
10 Statutes 6.86(1)(b)) voting on 9/26/2020 and 10/3/2020, etc., should not be allowed
11 membership in the Republican Party of Washington County, or be expelled if they are members;
12 and,

13 **Whereas**, such absolutely minimal membership expectations and requirements for the
14 Washington County Republican Party undermine the integrity, meaning, and value of those
15 members who genuinely embrace and live true conservative values (e.g., real support for our
16 Constitutional USA republic, maximum individual rights and freedoms, limited government at all
17 levels, self-defense, deep respect for life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness, the rule of law
18 (vs. men/mob), free enterprise, etc.) by encouraging and allowing membership by those who are
19 actually fundamentally opposed to true conservative values (this is not theoretical; people with
20 consistently demonstrated Leftist views, actions, and policies are now WCRP members); and,

21 **Whereas**, no mechanism currently exists in the Republican Party of Washington County
22 constitution or by-laws to deny membership to, or remove membership from, those who clearly
23 espouse values, views, positions, and practices opposed to what are supposed to be the truly
24 conservative beliefs, principles, values, and policies of the Republican Party of Washington
25 County; and,

26 **Whereas**, the Republican Party of Walworth County (RPWC) is currently revising the
27 Membership section (Article IV- Membership) of its constitution (and such revisions have
28 already passed review by the Republican Party of Wisconsin) to state:

29 "Section 1. Membership

30 Any resident of Walworth County who is eligible to vote in Wisconsin state elections and
31 is not a member of another political party or any political organization whose views and
32 practices are contrary to the platform of the Republican Party of Wisconsin may be
33 eligible for a voting membership in the RPWC and could be considered a member in
34 good standing.

35 Anyone who requests membership in the RPWC must submit a written current
36 membership application and applicable fees. That application will be reviewed by the
37 Membership Committee and/or Executive Board or Executive Committee. The applicant
38 will be notified at the earliest possible date of their acceptance or declination of

1 membership. If a membership is declined, the reason must be stated in writing to the
2 applicant.

3 A Member in good standing is someone whose dues are not more than 30 calendar
4 days past due, someone whose membership is not suspended, and someone who is in
5 compliance with paragraph one of this article and the objectives as described in Article III
6 of this Constitution.

7 Section 2. Suspend, Expel, and Readmit

8 The Executive Board or Executive Committee by a two-thirds vote may suspend a
9 membership for cause. Any suspension must be brought before the membership at the
10 next regularly scheduled meeting of the membership.

11 Any member may be expelled or readmitted in this organization by a two-thirds vote of
12 the membership present during an expulsion or re-admittance meeting.

13 For suspension, expulsion and readmittance procedures refer to the Bylaws of this
14 organization."

15 ***Therefore be it resolved,*** that the Washington County Republican Party in caucus assembled,
16 demands that the leadership (i.e., Board members and Officers) of the Republican Party of
17 Washington County will incorporate all of the above enhanced membership criteria proposed by
18 the Republican Party of Walworth County for its Constitution into the existing membership
19 criteria of the Republican Party of Washington County, and follow all requirements of Article IX
20 (Amendments) of the Constitution of the Republican Party of Washington County to properly
21 and timely prepare, and correctly notice (to the membership) this incorporated, enhanced
22 criteria as a constitutional amendment to be voted on by the membership at the February, 2024
23 Annual Caucus of the Republican Party of Washington County.
